Instructions

Background: At this mapping station, you are asked to identify **Special Places** in the area of **Cultural, Historic & Archeological Resources**. These places may exist now and need to be preserved, protected or enhanced/improved, *OR* they may not exist yet, but are “good ideas” to create or consider – see below.

Step 1: (If a Group has gone before you, review what the other group has done and build on their efforts.) As a group, Identify a Special Place or a Good Idea (one at a time – take turns). Discuss this Place or idea briefly among the group to understand what and where it is, and why it’s important to you and the Town.

Step 2: Locate that Place on the Map, and draw a dot, line, or circle (or other shape) to show where it is located. [Try and do this neatly as other 2 groups will use the same map.]

Step 3: Put a Number next to the shape (Start at 1 if you’re the first group, start at the next number in the table if you’re following another group).

Step 4: Fill in the information about each Place or Idea in the Table. (If a group has gone before you, feel free to add information to the “Why It’s Important” part of the table for Places or Idea they entered.)

- ✓ A **Cemetery**
- ✓ A Place for **Community Gatherings**, such as for concerts, celebrations, special events
- ✓ A **Native American Settlement** site
- ✓ The **Library**
- ✓ **Farms, Orchards** or **Other Places** important to the culture & identity of Standish

Examples of Possible Special Places or Good Ideas
